REMINDERS:

The business office will be closed Memorial Day, May 28th and July 4th.

With warmer weather upon us, and driving often limited on the beach, Day Use is being utilized more and more. PLEASE remember to make a reservation for Day Use PRIOR to coming over. We are only allowed to take 15 reservations per day, and we'd hate for you to come over to only be turned away because we had reached the maximum number of reservations. Also please note that the owner (on the deed) must be present during Day Use, must sign in at the front desk, get a parking pass, and not have more than 5 people, including the owner(s). Also, Day Use is prohibited on holidays and holiday weekends.

If you have not made your reservation for 2018 yet, you're almost out of time! Reservation requests must be made in writing, and in the season that you own. Also, if you think you made a reservation but have not received a confirmation or space bank deposit confirmation from the exchange company, please contact us to make sure you actually have that reservation.

July 1 is opening day for 2019 Preferred Season reservations. All written reservation requests received PRIOR to this date with payment of the estimated fees (\$605.05 and \$654.09) will be put in a drawing on JUNE 30th and selected at random to be filled. Reservation Request Forms are available to print from the owners section of www.VacationFLA.com; or you can just send a letter. In past years, over 500 reservations have been filled on this date.

LOCAL HAPPENINGS:

June is packed full of things to do! There are several events throughout the month like cooking classes and BBQ's at Rype and Ready; car shows, Star Wars, Jurassic World, and lots of golf related events at World Golf Village, Historic Weapons Demonstrations each weekend at the Castillo De San Marcos, Music By the Sea continues every Wednesday at the pier, various Farmer's Markets, Bird and Marsh walks, Turtle talks, Art exhibits, sails, paddles and drifts! The St. Augustine Amphitheatre has outdone itself with John Fogerty and ZZ Top on the 5th, Harry Connick, Jr. on the 8th, Paramore on the 12th, I Love the 90's tour on the 16th, Rebelution's Free Rein Summer Tour on the 24th and Boy George and the Culture Club with the b-52's on the 29th.

Beginning May 31 – Concerts in the Plaza returns. This popular weekly event falls into a tradition shared by many communities: enjoying a concert in the town square on a summer night. Free and open to the public, residents and visitors alike can enjoy great entertainment in a great place together every Thursday between Memorial Day and Labor Day from 7-9 p.m.

June 1 – 24 – The Limelight Theatre presents Come Back to the Five and Dime Jimmy Dean, Jimmy

Dean, the story of the 20th reunion of a group named the Disciples of James Dean. Performance times are 7:30 p.m. Thursday-Saturday and 2 p.m. on Sunday.

June 2 – The English corsair, Sir Francis Drake, and his raiders return to St. Augustine for an authentic re-creation of the 1586 sack of the city. Join Drake and his raiders from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. for the 16th century-style military encampment at the Fountain of Youth Park located at 11 Magnolia Ave.; regular park admission applies. There will be drills, demonstrations and living history interpretations. The re-enactment of the sacking and burning of the town will be at 7 p.m. in the old city, beginning at the City Gate on Orange Avenue and ending in the Plaza.

Wednesdays, beginning June 6th - The free Summer Movie Series at the Colonial Oak Music Park resumes at 8:30pm each week. The Red Train will offer complimentary shuttles from Ripley's to St. George St. starting at 7:30 p.m. There will also be a pick up on the north end of St. George St. following the film to return to Ripley's. 6/6: Breaking Legs - High School Dance Movie; 6/13: Beauty and the Beast; 6/20: Jumanji and 6/27: Wonder Woman

June 16th - The award-winning, 278th anniversary commemoration of the 1740 Spanish victory at the Battle of Bloody Mose will occur from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. at Fort Mose Historic State Park. Also featured will be battle re-enactments at noon and at 2 p.m. between the British and Scottish invaders and the victorious Spanish defenders along with the free black militia and Native American auxiliaries.

June 21 – 30 - The St. Augustine Music Festival is a series of six free concerts held throughout two weekends in the historic Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine. The concerts take place Thursday to Saturday at 7:30 p.m. with a different performance each evening. This year's event includes the return of young violin sensation Nigel Armstrong, a two-piano concert evening featuring a Mozart double-piano concerto and Saint-Saens' Carnival of the Animals, charismatic cellist Andres Diaz and a program combining the cathedral's two, magnificent pipe organs with brass ensembles.
